Rules Governing these Alliance Male Youth Championships

1. These Championships shall be governed by the entry conditions set out below, which may from time to time vary with the Rule Book currently in print.
2. Competitors may be British or Non-British and must be registered with the Amateur Boxing Alliance (England) CIC. Competitors must represent the Club on the entry form throughout the Championships. They must have had a minimum of 2 Alliance bouts on entry. They must declare numbers of competitive bouts in other combat sports. These numbers must be entered at the top of page 1 on the medical card.
Acceptance of entry does not necessarily imply that the entrant is eligible or that he will be allowed to compete. Those in doubt as to their eligibility should refer their case to the Hon. Secretary of their Association, or to the Alliance office.
Non- British competitors must have held a medical card for 1 year from the date of their first medical entered in their card.
3. The weight entered on the form is the weight the competitor will box in the championship. Once the entry form has been accepted, boxers will not be able to move weights.
4. The entry form must be signed by the competitor, giving his correct name, date of birth and address. A parent or guardian, who will be held responsible for the correctness of the statement made thereon, must endorse the entry form. The Hon. Secretary of the competitor's club or organisation must also sign the entry form, to verify that the competitor's details are correct.
5. By entering these Championships, a competitor's parent or guardian will have been deemed to give consent to allow his name, photographs and video footage to be used in all media for publicity purposes, if required.
6. There's NO weight Allowance at these championships.
7. During the 2-hour Weigh in period boxers up to 50kgs category may lose a maximum of 300grams, up to 63kgs- 500 grams. and over 63kgs- 700 grams. Boxers may have as many check weighs as they wish up to the official closure of the scales.
8. Competitors must wear boxing shorts or underpants when weighing-in.
9. Gloves - Boxers under 63.5kg to compete in 10oz and over 63.5kg to compete in 12oz Alliance approved and stamped gloves, supplied by the organisers.
10. A boxer may have a maximum of 2 Coaches in his corner. Training shoes or boxing boots, tracksuits or suitable sportswear must be worn by all Coaches (shorts or civilian clothing must not be worn). No head wear to be worn by any ringside coach. Mobile phones or other electrical devices are not permitted at ringside.
11. ME3s must be produced at the time of time of weighing in at all stages of the Championships.
12. Officials' expenses for these championships are to be paid by the event organisers.
13. All boxers shall wear a gum shield, cup protector, Alliance approved bandages on the hands and an Alliance approved and stamped Head-guard when competing. No red gum shields may be worn.
14. Where both boxers in the eliminating round of a weight class are disqualified the Association or Associations jointly concerned will be permitted to nominate a representative to the next stage provided the nominee has entered and weighed-in for his Association Championships.

16. All participants i.e. boxers and coaches, are reminded that these Championships are subject to the Alliance Anti –Doping Rules.
- 16 Scoring clickers, using 3 judges, shall be used at all stages of these Championships.
17. If there is no opponent for a boxer to compete in the National Final, he will only be awarded the National Title if he has boxed at an earlier stage.
18. If necessary, to define the 'belt' line, competitors will be required to wear the appropriate colour sash.
19. No boxer shall wear a RED vest in the BLUE corner or a BLUE vest the RED corner.
20. All boxers SHALL wear a RED head-guard and gloves in the RED corner and a BLUE head-guard and gloves in the BLUE corner.
21. Class A will box 3 x 2 minute rounds and class B will box 3x 2 minute rounds.
22. Forms and a cheque for £20 must be sent to the Alliance Championship Secretary below. Cheques should be made payable to the association where the boxer is registered with i.e. Home Counties ABA, London ABA or South West ABA. If paid by Bank Transfer, a copy of the payment must be enclosed with the application.
